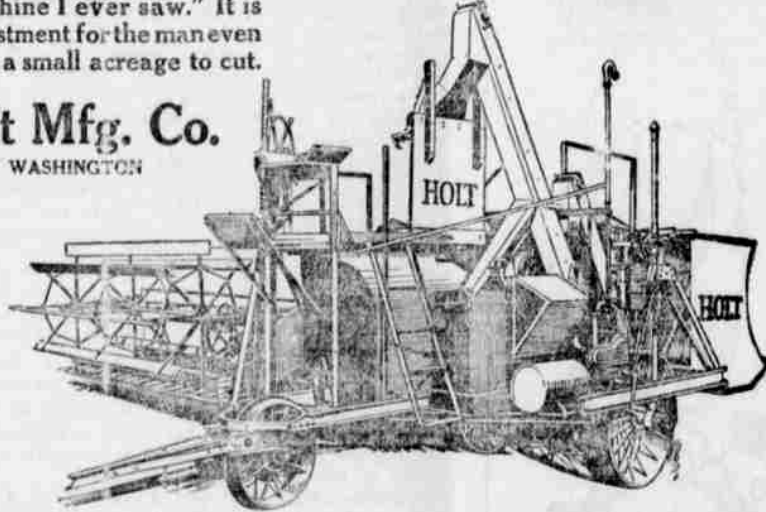

ORDINANCE NO. 112

An Ordinance to prevent, restrain, and regulate minors being on the streets, alleys or roadways within the limits of the City of Ione, at certain hours, and providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance, and repealing all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith.

Be it Ordained By The Common Council Of The City Of Ione, Oregon:

Sec. 1. That from and after the passage of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen years to be upon any Street, Alley or Road within the limits of the City of Ione, Oregon, between the hour of 9:00 o'clock P. M. and the hour of 5:00 o'clock A. M., unless said minor shall be accompanied by his or her parent or legal guardian, or upon written instruction signed by his or her parent or legal guardian to perform some necessary duty or business for such parent or legal guardian, such written instruction or notice must state the nature and character of such necessary business, and upon request of the City Marshall or other Police Officer such minor must immediately deliver the same to said Marshall or other Police Officer, and said Marshall or Police Officer must retain possession of such written instrument until he shall ascertain whether or not the same was signed by said minor's parent or legal guardian, or that such duty or business was absolutely necessary, said minor upon the performance of such duty or business must immediately return to his or her place of residence or abode.

Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the City Marshall or other Police Officer on duty at the hour of 9:00 o'clock P. M. to give a signal, by giving three taps of the fire bell, which said signal shall be a warning to all such minors that it is time to proceed to vacate the Public Streets, Alleys and Roads.

Sec. 3. Any minor found guilty of the violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in a sum not to exceed \$25.00 and in default of the payment of any fine assessed hereunder, shall be imprisoned in the City Jail one day for each \$2.50 of such fine imposed.

Sec. 4. In as much as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Ione, Oregon, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

Sec. 5. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
