Voters Should Take Notice

The question has been raised as to whether a legal voter who is not registered may register on election day and vote. The last legislature amended the primary election law so as to provide that no registered voter may change his party designation within 30 days of the primary election. No voter has the right to re-register on election day for the purpose of changing from one party to another. But an unregistered voter may register by signing the proper oath on the card furnished and have two witnesses make the necessary affidavit, just as heretofore.

Another question has been asked. Can voters who are not entitled to take part in the primary election vote on the county unit measure? Only voters registered as republicans or democrats may vote in the primary election but the members of other parties and voters registered as independent or without party affiliation may vote the special election ticket on the county unit measure. So, if you are registered as a socialist, a prohibitionist, a progressive or of no party affiliation, you may and should vote on the county unit measure, as also all democrats and republicans.

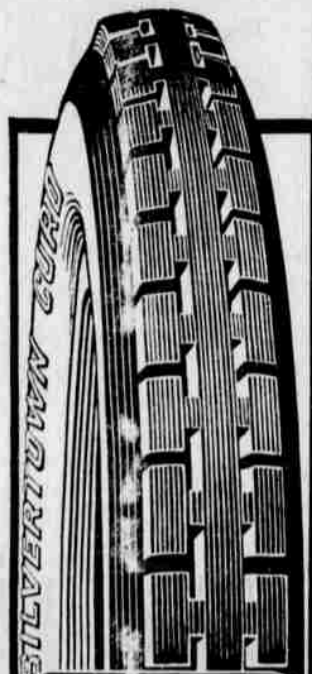

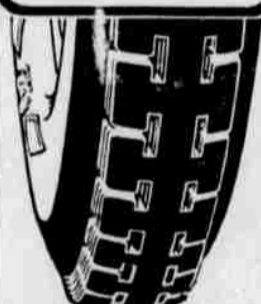
