Federation To Be Tried Out In Morrow County

For the past two years Federation wheat has yielded exceptionally well on the heavier lands in Umatilla county. This summer it was the highest yielding wheat in the nursery on the Lawrence Redding farm at Eightmile. To give this variety a thorough trial County Agent Morse has secured a small shipment of seed from Umatilla county, which will be put out on the heavier lands of the county. Previous tests with Federation on the lighter lands show that it is not well adapted to these lands. While it yielded well in the Eightmile nursery, Federation ranked 19th in the Ione nursery at Troy Bogard's.
