Prospects for Completion O.-W. Highway Not Good

It was not with any great degree of optimism that Judge Campbell and Commissioner Davidson made a visit to Portland during the past week to hold a confab with the state highway commission; in fact their enthusiasm was so small and their knowledge gained from previous visits was so great, that they did not appear at the sittings of the commission at the court house in Multnomah county at all, but used a little strategy and got a hearing with Commissioner Doby on the side, presenting their proposition to him. It did not take long to find where he stood. Mr. Doby is a kindly gentleman, and well disposed to do all that he can for every county in the state finding itself somewhat in our position, but what is to be done when the county has no money to put on the table, and has to come up with the proposition of seeking aid for the completion of a state highway within its borders and has to admit that they can offer no cooperation. So there seems just at present no solution to the problem of completing the Oregon-Washington highway in this state. The seeking of federal aid is fruitless, and in order to get money to cooperate to an extent that the state highway commission might aid us, would necessitate a bond issue and this, too, is impossible and cannot be thought of.

Commissioner Doby has consented to make a visit to Heppner in the near future, when the entire situation will be gone over with the business men here and the attitude of the commission in this regard be made fully known. -Gazette-Times, Heppner
