We have examined the signed statement and exhibits upon which the foregoing tabulation is based and find that the total of \$41,252,350 is a conservative estimate of damage properly attributable to the state income tax as a determining factor in influencing decision against Oregon investment in the cases listed. We also find that many additional amounts could have been included justifiably in the total, so that, making every allowance for possible overstatements in individual items listed, the actual loss of investment attributable to the state income tax is materially in excess of \$40,000,000.
