High School Notes

Friday, December 5, the pupils of the Ione Public Schools moved from the old schoolhouse to the new one. At 2:30 o'clock the high school boys carried the high school desks over and each person carried their own books. At 3:15 o'clock the grade processions started with each instructor as leader. Their arms were full of books and their pockets full of pencils, erasers, and crayolas, and their faces covered with smiles. The pupils of the 7th and 8th grades sandpapered all their desks and then varnished them, so that now they can sit in desks that they can easily imagine are new.

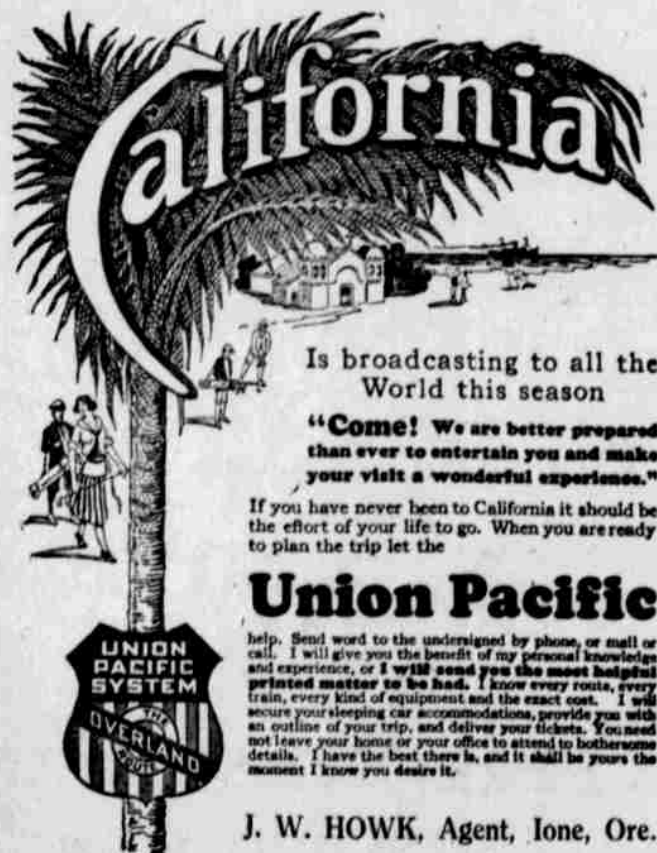
