LONE TREE FARMERS UNANIMOUS

No Bond Issue for Them They Say

A meeting of farmers was held in Lone Tree school house last Saturday night for the purpose of discussing the proposed \$500,000.00 road bond issue.

Every one present was opposed to the issue for two main reasons: 1st, that it is inadvisable under present hard conditions to vote bonds, thereby adding taxes to the present heavy burden; 2nd that the amount allotted to this district is insufficient to complete the Lone-Boardman road and that in the near future another issue will be needed to finish it and the others too.

It was contended by many that they were unable to pay their taxes under present conditions and that it is not only poor business to increase them.

Others contended that the amounts allotted to the various districts was merely a bait to pass the issue for the purpose of completing the highways that lead to Heppner.

The meeting passed resolutions condemning the bond issue and all present agreed to use their influence to defeat the measure.
