FIGHT ON SCARLET FEVER

Dr. Francis G. Blake, of the Yale Medical school, in a carefully prepared report upon prolonged experimentation with the new serum for the treatment of scarlet fever, announces that in a great number of cases treated, cures were effected in all of them, no matter how serious nor how far advanced. Dr. Blake's conclusion is that the serum used in the treatment of scarlet fever cases is fully as effective as that used in the treatment of cases of diphtheria. We saw no mention in Dr. Blake's report of the subject of after effects—doctors call them sequelae—of scarlet fever, says the Petersburg Progress-Index. It is presumed that these likewise are controlled by the serum. Thus, another and almost the last of the diseases of childhood yields to medical science.

RECORD OUTPUT OF LIGHTING EQUIPMENT

Lighting equipment worth \$205,866,000, or more than half a million dollars a day, was manufactured and distributed for use in American homes and factories last year, according to a report just issued by the Department of Commerce.

This total marks a new high record for the industry, and is 13.8 per cent more than that of 1923. Itself a record year, with a total of \$100,926,000.
