## Clasping Hands in Prayer

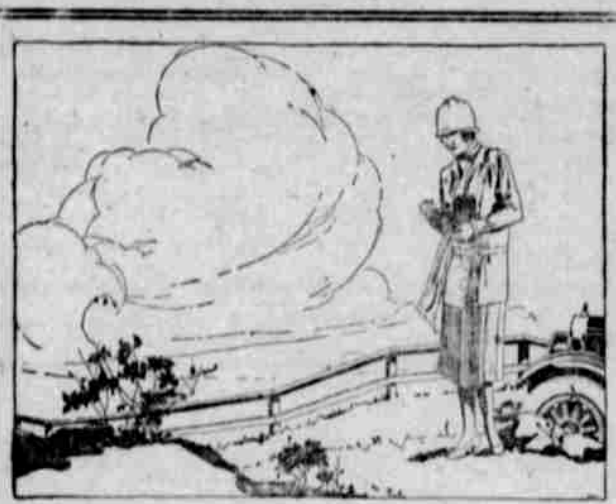

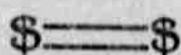

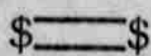
