### BONDS AND BALLOTS

The proposed bond issue carried at the special election held last week and as we see it the only thing to regret is the small size of the vote cast. In Ione the vote was a tie with 120 votes cast out of a total registration of 240.  
This failure to vote is an outstanding feature of American elections whether special or general. Only rarely will sufficient interest developed to call out the full vote or even an approximation to it.  
It may be argued that the vote cast is a cross section of the total electorate and as representative of the public sentiment in regard to any issue presented as a vote approximating the total registration would be.  
This may be true, but assuming that it is so under ordinary circumstances, but when there are special interests at stake, a failure to vote on the part of those who have only a public interest in the result, enables the special interest concerned to win the election by the simple expedient of getting out the full vote favorable to the view or purpose of the private interest involved.  
To cultivate the voting habit is a duty that we owe to ourselves and to the state. Whoever fails is derelict in duty.

### Give Your Clothes a Rest

THE weary waistcoat and the tired trousers—these are not fancies of the imagination but cold realities. You wouldn't make your horse go day after day without a rest or run your car without giving the engine a chance to cool off. And in just the same way your clothes have an occasional vacation coming to them once in a while if you want to get the most wear out of them.

It is known that even steel, when constantly used, gets what engineers call "metal fatigue." Wool is no exception. The sturdiest wool fibers become flattened and pressed out of shape by continuous use. Their strength returns, if they are allowed to rest up a bit.
