It may be argued that the vote cast is a cross section of the total electorate and as representative of the public sentiment in regard to any issue presented as a vote epproximating the total registration would be.

This may be true, but assum ing that it is so under ordinary circumstances, but when thereare special interests at stake, a failure to vote on the part of those who have only a public interest in the result, enables the special interest concerned to win the election by the simple expedient of getting out the full vote favorable to the view or purpose of the private interest involved.
