We learn from the news dispatches that Senator Stanfield, while feeling that was the victim of most dastardly outrage at the town of Baker, has, nevertheless, highly resolve that it shall not have been in vain. From this time, henceforth and forever, he will devote his personal energies and official powers to the propagation and cultivation of drouth. From Baker's fatal day he will be the driest of the dry.
