An important step in standard ization, by which nhe leading manufacturers of the incandescent lamp hope to achieve for them selves and toe public economies hitherto impossible, has been taken dy the General Electric and Westinghouse Companies. A new standard Maz ia bulb for ordinary use has been adopted and production to provide a amp the use of which is intended to be universal through the grad ual elimination of the many types of these lights now on the mar-

ket. The home owner is to be the immediate benficiary of the new policy. He will be able to procure lights of greater utility at less cost than is now entoiled. However, since many commercial establishments and office buildings use small watt lamps, they will be correspondingly benefited.

Instead of fortyfive stanard zed lamps of the present or old design there to be only five. The first of the five has been placed on the market at prices 10 to 13 cents below the cost of the old ones.
