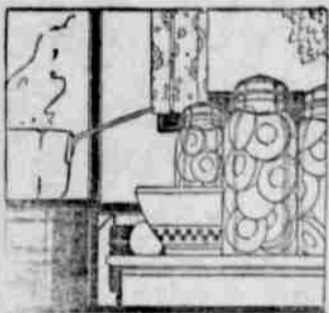

## BANKERS HELP

The banks of Linn County Oregon, are showing more enthusiasm than ever this year in behalf of a county corn exhibit similar to that held last year at the Linn County Fair. Last year's exhibit was the result of a contest for a prize offered by a number of local banks. This was so successful that this year ten out of the eleven banks in the county will subscribe to the effort.

The Agricultural Committee of the Alabama Bankers Association has recommended that a scholarship fund be established for the education of worthy young men and women along agricultural and home economics lines. It is estimated that if each bank in the state were to contribute 25 cents per thousand capital, five to six thousand dollars per annum would be realized.

The Agricultural Committee of the Oklahoma Bankers Association, in its report, recommends that the bankers see that a competent agent is appointed in each county and that he has a degree from some agricultural college. They believe that the agricultural possibilities of the state should be better advertised and that each county bankers association should do some work along that line.

Searcy County Bankers Association, Arkansas, entertained as its guests recently some seventy-five farmers and business men. The result was the organization of the North Central Arkansas Agricultural Association. Its purpose will be to co-ordinate the efforts of the farmers and business men in promoting a better agriculture. Searcy County bankers are giving 100 seedlings of purchased eggs for distribution to the boys' and girls' clubs in the county.

## IONE DEFEATS ARLINGTON HIGH SCHOOL FOOT BALL TEAM WINS VICTORY SCORE IS 19:3

The Ione High School foot ball team defeated the Arlington High School team on the local field here last Saturday by a score of 19-3.

Ione kicked off to Arlington and the game was on. As the teams were quite evenly matched at the end of the first half, the score stood 6-0 in Ione's favor; John Graves having made a touch down during the first quarter. In the third quarter Arlington scored three points but John Graves again made a touch down. Ione succeeded in making their only inter this touch down. This made the score 13-3 in Ione's favor.

In the last quarter David Head intercepted one of Arlington's passes and made a touch down, making the final score 19-3.

## S. P. Plans for R. R. Development In Oregon and No. Calif.

New Lines Mean Expenditure of \$38,000,000; Protection of Investment Necessary

Southern Pacific Company's plans for railroad development in southern Oregon and northern California and its views with respect to the proposed entry of the Oregon Trunk Railway into this territory, as developed from authoritative Southern Pacific sources, were printed at Klamath Falls, Oregon, September 2. The News article in part is as follows:

The Southern Pacific has announced a very definite program for construction centering in Klamath Falls. The new lines proposed under these plans give a direct route for through traffic from southern Oregon, northern California, western Oregon and the North Pacific Coast generally via Klamath Falls to the east through Ogden. They give the timber districts tributary to Klamath Falls railroads that will bring logs and lumber of southern Oregon and northern California to this city. Likewise, these lines will develop the agricultural regions of this same section. Briefly then, a comprehensive plan has been adopted that gives all the necessary local service for the development of northern California and southern Oregon and uses in therewith a direct railway service to all the markets of the United States that may be made tributary to the Klamath Falls section, and in this construction of new lines Klamath Falls is the center.

Steps Taken by S. P.

To this end the Southern Pacific has taken the following steps:

First, finishing construction of the area cutoff, as a through line will be done by midsummer of next year at an expense of approximately \$23,000,000, in addition to money already invested in the Klamath Falls-Eugene-Oakridge tranches.

Second, the acquisition, subject to approval of the interstate commerce commission, of all the common stock and the bonds of the Nevada-California-Oregon Railway, extending on Wendel, California, near Susanville, 136 miles northward to Lakeview, Oregon.

Third, acquisition of an interest in Oregon, California and Eastern Oregon (the Strahora line), subject to the approval of the interstate commerce commission, which assures the necessary financial support to extend the lines eastward to the Lakeview and northeast into Silver Lake and with a branch up the Williamson river, Mr. Strahora already being made applications to cover such extensions.
