THE IONE INDEPENDENT TAILORS' GUILD ORGANIZED TO UPLIFT THE PROFESSION

O BGANIZATION of the Born Tallors, Guild, an association of master tallors, with headquarters in Chicago, was announced today by W. A. Churchill, executive secretary of the new league. The slogan of the Guild is "Tailors are born, nor made," and its two-fold object is to lift the inliering trade to a higher


plane of perfect on in the art of making clothes for men, and establish in the minds of men and boys a definite approclation of style, tabele and tallorship in men's clothes, just as the Parisian designers have made every woman a connoisseur of feminine fashions. Wage scales, labor controversies and price fixing will have no place in the work of Born Tailors Guibl, according to Mr. Churchill, "Our purpose in organizing this Guild," said Mr.

Churchill, "he to bind together the master tallors of Ameron, united in an effort of raising the standards of our trade There is real artistry in the making of clothes and our ticals to place our trade in the class of art. Our objective is for the making of better clothes for men, the perfection of our trade to the very highest point possible."

Back to craft organization of early English times, Mr. Churchill and his associates went to get a model for their association. In these times each craft had its own guild and received a charact from the king. Occasionally the kings were members of them. Guild members were bound by eath of brotherliness to uphold the standards of the profession and to pass down from generation to generation the treasured secrets of that craft. Before a man could become a master tallor he had to serve seven

years as an apprentice, then as a jou beginsh for two years, during which time he was taught all the skill and secretacof the trade. After preparing an exceptionally fine piece of work, his masterplece, which he submitted to the Guild Assembly, the journeyman became a moster and was admit-ted to the Guild. The spirit of this select type of craft association has been made the background of the Born Tallors' Guild, according to Mr. Churchill, "We seek to bring back into the tallbring craft some

of the old-time romance and identism of Tooley Street," he said. "We want our master tallors to reassert their pride is perfection of workmanship and to study men's dress
