New Refugee Problem in Syria.

Beirut, Syria.—The Near East Relief will distribute 50,000 pounds of refugee clothing here, to assist in caring for 20,000 Christian villagers rendered homeless by the rebellion of the Moslem Druses against the French government. All Americans have been ordered to leave Damascus, where 2,500 persons were killed in the fighting of the past fortnight. Thousands of refugees are pouring into Beirut.

October 31st there were 30,000 Armenian refugees in Beirut, crowded into an "unspeakable" camp, and refugees were arriving from Damascus at the rate of 4000 daily. The refugees were sheltered in houses constructed of oil tins and "the crowding was terrible," as many as nine people living in a single small room, cooking, eating and sleeping in this tiny quarter.

The sanitary arrangements were totally inadequate and water scarce. Many of the refugees were ill, with no medicine and the children were pale and sickly.

Representative Johnson Indorses Plan

Representative Albert Johnson, of Washington, in a letter to the Near East Relief, states that "the plan of training children under the care of the Association for their own peculiar conditions and fitting them for usefulness in their own land is, in my opinion, the correct plan."

In every Near East Relief orphanage the children are trained for self support at the age of sixteen. The girls to work on farms, to be nurses, teachers, rug makers, seamstresses, lace makers; the boys to be farmers, blacksmiths, carpenters, tinmiths and shoemakers.
