HARRISBURG, Ore., Jan. 14. The body of Franklin T. Ross, drowned in the Sweet Home vicinity during the high water of last Februnry, was recovered near Sweet Home yesterday. A tag bearing the name "Estil Hill, Harrisburg, Oregon", was found on the body, and the authorities believed that she, now Mrs. Ber Holt, of Halsey, might identify the body. Mrs. Holt said that she had lost the tag years ago. It is presumed that Ross found it and kept it. Identification was accomplished later by other means.

Mrs. James A. Taylor's dream that the body of her brother would be discovered, well preserved, in the waters of the river which took his life 11 months ago, came true today when she was notified that the body had been found. Mrs. Taylor resides here. Last summer Mrs. Taylor dreamt that an embankment had caved into the water, burying the already submerged body, and that when his was found it would be easily identified.
