

The extreme disadvantage of a loop antenna, however, is that with the gain of directional quality and possible selectivity, the overall received signal strength from a given station is usually very much reduced requir-ing a receiver of extreme sensitivity, and possibly instability, if far-distant stations are to be received.

The drawing illustrates four different methods of connecting loop an-tennas to a radio receiver set. It will be often found that by using either of the methods shown here satisfactory reception of local and semi-distant broadcasting stations up to possibly 200 to 500 miles can be had.

When using a loop with neutrodyne radio receivers, it is extremely desirable that the loop be placed from 6 feet to 10 feet away from the receiver to eliminate possible interference with one another. Results with a loop can probably be equaled if not excelled by using about 20 feet of wire strung around the picture molding, making up a simple indoor antenna.-Cleve land News.




Diagram Showing How to Install the UX 112 Tube, Using Storage "A" Battery.

## Catarrhal Deatness National Kadio Fading Tests Start February 9

Dates for the national tests of radio reception to determine the causes of static and fading were announced recently after 4,000 of the 4,500 designated observation stations had expressed a willingness to take part in the survey, which is being conducted by the Stewart-Warner Speedometer corporation in co-operation with the Northwestern university. The first fest will be held on the night of February 9, from 8 to 11 p. m. central standard time. The second and third will be on the two succeeding nights at the same hours. Subsequent tricks will be held throughout the winter, should the data obtained indicate that real progress in a search for the causes of these two major radio annoyances is possible.

It was originally planned to hold these tests in January, but owing to the international tests scheduled for that month it was decided to hold the fading and static tests at a later date. Most of the observations will be: made by broadcast listeners using standard receiving sets and depending for the accuracy of their reports upon their own ears. However, to insure the scientific accuracy of the result, 20 control stations equipped with electrical measuring devices and automatic recorders will be placed in the principal broadcasting centers of the country.


