

#### Show Definite Value of Municipal Forests

The government is still by far the largest interest committed to true conservation, and the national forests are the largest areas under this type of management. The obvious reasons for this condition are the paramount public interest, the enduring character of the government, its freedom from taxation, and like advantages. What the national and state governments have done in this field is too familiar for repetition here, but there is a new governmental development in forestry that is worthy of notice. This is the movement for town forests, French Strother observes, in the World's Work

This movement was inspired by observation of European experience. In Sweden, France and Germany many towns and cities own their own municipal woodlands, and operate them us a regular function of local government. So profitable are some of these town forests that they relieve the citizens of all local taxes. No such results could be hoped for in this country, but the advantages are so numerous that several states have enacted laws to encourage towns to acquire municipal forests. Such woodlands provide employment for labor, raw material for local needs (even material for small local mills, at a price that saves the consumer the freight). and a near-by recreation ground of great social value. In some places, the town forest is an invaluable protective cover for the local water supply.

#### Industrial Experts Will Advise Towns

An approved list of industrial experts to advise cities and towns on sys and means of obtaining the type of industries suitable to their location loss been started by the National Associntion of Real Estate Boards at the spection of the industrial property division of that body.

A large propertion of the 557 mem-her boards of the national association throughout the United States and Canada are co-operating with cities in locating new industries. The Knoxville (Tenn.) chamber of commerce has asked the local bound for its aid in a campaign for factories. The San Francisco real estate board and the clumber of commerce are making joint effort to aid manufacturers in securling the best possible sites by making complete listings of all industrial properties.

#### Consolidated Schools

Comparing costs and results of eduention in consolidated and in oneteacher schools in Connecticut shows that 29 per cent of pupils fourteen years of age in one-room schools drop out during the school year, but orsy S per cent in consolidated schools strop out; 41 per cent of those fifteen years of age in one-room schools drop out as compared with 12 per cent in comsolidated schools. The percentage elimination in the fifth, sixth, sevent b. and eighth grades of one-teach er schools is approximately twice as great as in the same grades in cc nsolidated schools. Of the teachers in one-teacher schools, 23 per cent ha we had two years or more of profession ad red with 40 per co mi in consolidated schools; and teachs ws in consolidated schools have on I he average two years more experies ce than those in one-teacher schools. -School Life.

Legion of Honor Origin

The Legion or Honor, the famous French order, was instituted by Napoleon Bonaparte when he was first consul, May 19, 1802. Although this order confers honors upon distin-guished civil servants of the state and eminent benefactors of humanity, it is provided that three-fifths of all the medals awarded must go to the officers and men of the army and navy. During the World war thousands of the medals of the legion were awarded to soldiers and public servants. There are now five classes, the Grand

cross being the highest. Many American and British citizens received the medul of the Legion of Honor, and immediately after the war it was also conferred upon the milltury leaders of the allies of France.

Builders' Device

The principle of the entants, which is a swelling or outward curve of the profile of the shaft of a column or pillar, is utilized to avoid appearance of concavity in its middle portion. In the finest examples of Greek Doric the swelling is a little below the middle point of the shaft, but never so great as to interfere with the steady diminution of the shaft from the base upward. The entasis is designed partly to counteract the optical illusion which would cause the profiles of the shaft to appear curved inward if they were bounded by straight lines. The entasts is almost invariably introduced in the spires of English churches.




