Inasmuch as the one purchasing a policy from this company does not have the protection of thi department, or of any of the laws of Oregon, it is appropriate that the citizens shouldbe informed regard ing this class of insurance
There are two primary causes for mail order insurance: First, to rscaye the payment of taxes; and second, to avoid the restrictions placed upon licensed companics for the protection of policy old-
Should a claim against one of these policies be contested, the policy holder would be forced to go to the courts of Kansas for recourse, as the courts of Oregon would be closed to him.
In purchasing insurance of any kind it is advisable to patronise only those companies thrt are licensed to do business in this state, as these companies are under the surpervision of the insurance department and are amenable to all of the laws of the state of Orecon. O) Sill Moore
