#### Have Efficient Ground and Get Satisfaction

importance of an efficient cround connection can hardly be over estimated. If there is a resistance to he passage of the high frequency osillations in any part of the aerial or ground circuit, you find your reeiver lacks pop, oscillates badiy and times broadly. Pep or volume, stabillity and selectivity are three things every fan likes to have in his set, but a large number do not realize what a strong influence a good ground connection has in obtaining results.

It is worth while doing some experimenting with ground connections and you will probably find out some very interesting facts. One of the simples and best methods to use in testing the efficiency of various ground conn tions is to tune in a station as far distant as possible, then reduce the voluse until you can just hear the signal faintly. Make a note of the dial setting on the rheostat controlling the volume. Now disconnect the ground and try one of the others you have
