WAR TIME INSURANCE

Period For Reinstatement
Extended One Year.

Instructions have just been received by the Portland office of the U. S. Veteran's Bureau authorizing the reinstatement of war time insurance by ex service until July 2 1927, according to an announcement made by Kenneth L. Cooper, Regional Manager of the Bureau. The ex-service man also has until July 2, 1927 to secure the low rate five year policy.

The American Legion advocated this legislation on the grounds that many war veterans had not yet adjusted their economic affairs.
