Astoria Honors Founders, July 20, 21, and 22nd.

The historical center of the Pacific Northwest is the city of Astoria, located on the south bank of the mighty Columbia river a short distance from the shores of the Pacific ocean, the first settlement of white people in the vast and fertile empire which lies west of the Rockies and north of the California coast.

On July 20, 21 and 22, the arduous deeds of the pioneers are to be commemorated.

Vidcent Astor, a grandson of the founder of the city has erected a great column of stone on a commanding height in the city and this will be dedicated.

Creeps back to find the throbbing heart.

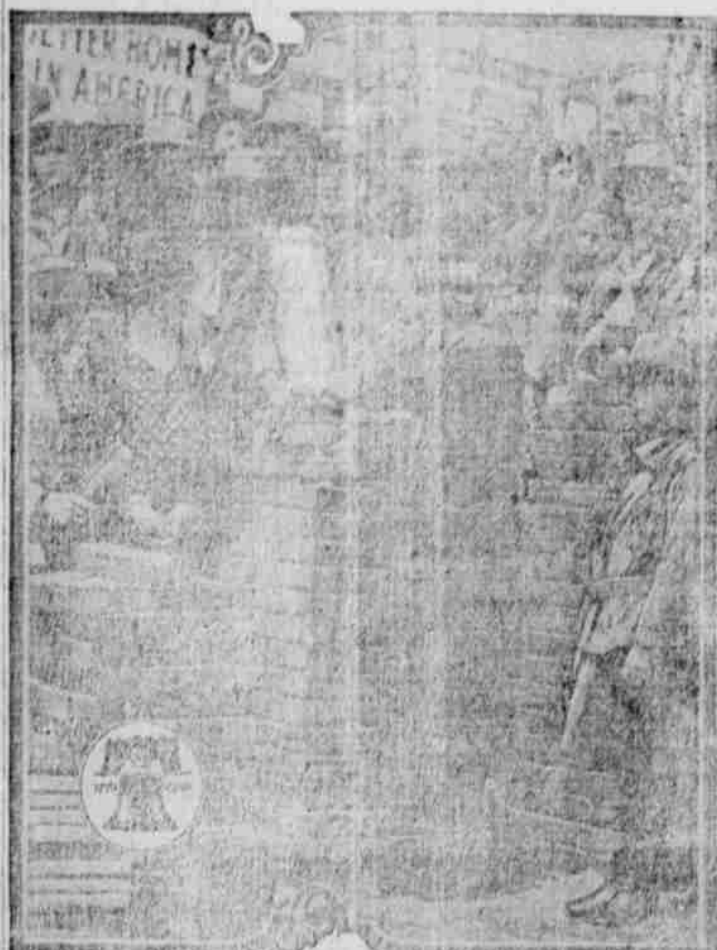
O Father! grant thy love divine
