WARNING

Speeding over 20 miles per hour within the limits of the city is strictly prohibited, and reckless drivers will be severely dealt with.

Cutting corners, or turning other than at intersections, or being on the wrong side of the street, is prohibited, and violations thereof will be dealt with according to law.

All parking must be done at 45 degree angle with walk, right front wheel within one foot of walk, except where it is impossible, owing to contour of street to park within one foot, but all parking must be at 45 degrees and as near walk as car can be placed.

The penalty for violation of the above sections of the City Ordinance, fine not to exceed \$100.00, or imprisonment not to exceed 50 days or both fine and imprisonment.

Turning other than at intersections, or being on the wrong side of the street are violations of the State traffic laws and will be dealt with accordingly.
