LIVE STOCK SHOW PREMIUM LIST

Sixteenth Annual Exposition
Promises to be Greatest Ever.

The prize list of the Annual Pacific International Livestock Exposition is divided amongst the various departments practically as follows: Dairy breeds, \$15,500; Beef breeds, \$16,000; Sheep and Goats, \$10,000; Hogs, \$3,750; Heavy Draft Horses and Night Horse Show, \$18,000 by the Exposition proper and \$18,000 by sponsors of stakes and from entry fees in these big classes, a total of \$36,000, making this show one of the largest horse shows in America, which distinction it has held for the past two years: Fat Stock classes, \$5,000; Boys' and Girls' Club Work \$5,000; Dairy products \$1,000; Judging teams, \$2,500, together with the groupings of other smaller items, which will bring the amount up to the \$100,000 mark.

entire Pacific Slope and Alaska will be shown and a movement is underway whereby the American National Fox Breeders' Association shall hold its National Show with us. If so it will probably mean the showing of at least a thousand fox, a wonderful exhibit in itself and one that will attract nation wide attention.

The "Truth in Meats" exhibit attracted so much attention last year and has resulted in so much good to the livestock industry that it has been decided to put it on again this year with added features. There will be shown the cost of producing a pound of beef from the time the ranch investment is made until the beefsteak is on the plate before the consumer.

The Dairy people are very much interested in on putting on a very constructive show of dairy products this year and the probabilities are that one far beyond any previous year will be staged. This in recognition of the tremendous importance of the dairy industry in this western country.

Boys' and Girls' Club Work has been given a very important place in the Pacific International and under authorization of the United States Department of Agriculture a sectional show has been arranged and a camp established. It will be called "Camp Plummer", being named after the manager of the Exposition, who, for the last fifteen years, has given much time and thought to this club feature.
