City Financially Easy

Fez, the "Holy City of Islam in Africa," boasts of being a city which owes nobody, has no municipal or other debts, and has never raised a loan either at home or abroad. Its budget in 1925 amounted to 5,500,000 francs entirely covered by revenues from taxation and the sale of concessions. Si Mohammed Tazy, pasha of the region of Fez, is also mayor of the city and every city document must bear his signature. The city government is composed of three distinct municipal commissions—Moslem, Jewish and French.
