Canadian Liberals Again in Control.

Ottawa, Ont.—The Liberal party returned to power in Canada after an eclipse of 88 days, when Arthur Meighen, Conservative leader, resigned, and Mackenzie King assumed the premiership.

Washington, D. C.—The federal government will have a surplus of more than \$200,000,000 for the fiscal year 1927, the treasury estimated.

Corvallis, Ore.—A new national champion was crowned here in the Oregon agricultural college flock when a Barred Rock hen known only as No. 1632 completed a year's laying record with 325 eggs, breaking the national record and tying the world record for the breed. This record was made while the hen was in a flock of 200 being cared for on a commercial basis.

President Approves Owyhee Plans
Washington, D. C.—Approval was given by President Coolidge to the Owyhee river irrigation project in Idaho and Oregon. The project would cost \$17,750,000 and would provide irrigation for 124,000 acres in the two states. Appropriations for carrying out the work must be made by congress upon the basis of the formal approval given.

THE FIRE
