EDUCATORS ATTEND DR. HALL INAUGURAL

Eugene, Ore.—In an impressive ceremony attended by renowned educators gathered here from all parts of the country, Dr. Arnold Bennett Hall, fifth president of the university, was inaugurated Monday. The inauguration marked the beginning of a week's festivities in which the founding of the university a half century ago, will be celebrated.

From a modest beginning with a total collegiate enrollment of less than 40 students, the University of Oregon has enjoyed marked progress and growth in its 50 years of existence and today boasts of a student body of nearly 3500, exclusive of summer session students, and those taking extension and correspondence work, who would bring the total to nearly 8000.

Reflecting the progress of the state, the University of Oregon has grown from one building to its present total of 35. Its original faculty of three members has long passed on, and its work is now carried on by a faculty numbering 157. The valuation of the university buildings in 1876 was \$50,000. Today it is \$3,500,000.

Dr. Clarence Cook Little, president of the University of Michigan, officiated at the inaugural of Dr. Hall, who comes to Oregon from the University of Wisconsin.
