Budget covering estimated expenses and proposed tax levy of the City of Ione, Oregon, for the year of 1927.

Notice is hereby given that on Friday, November 12, 1926 at the hour of eight o'clock P. M., the Common Council of the City of Ione, Oregon, will meet at the Council Chamber in said City, and any taxpayer of Ione, Oregon will be heard in favor of or against the tax levy as hereinafter proposed, which has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 118, of the General Laws of Oregon, for 1921, which

shows an estimate of the amount of money necessary to be raised by taxation by the City Government, to cover the expenses of the City during the ensuing year of 1927, also showing the probable receipts of said City, other than by a direct tax upon the real and personal property for the year of 1927.
