Bishop M. J. Hoban of the Scrant-

GRADE CROSSING ACCIDENTS

As indicative of practices of
drivers and the cause of grade
crossing accidents the following
cumulative record of accidents
occurring at grade crossings on
the Southern Pacific during the
last eight years ending Decem-
ber 31, 1925, merits review:

	No. Killed	Inj'd
Ran in front train	3620	428 1419
Ran into side train	1679	42 627
Stalled on track	942	31 129
Skidded into train	197	43
Ran into and broke crossing gates	1191	34
Ran into crossing flagman	45	3 39
Miscellaneous	88	1 39
Total	7761	505 2326

It will be noted that in nearly
22 per cent of the total accidents
automobiles ran into and struck
trains instead of trains striking
automobiles; that more than 15
per cent of total ran through and
broke down crossing gates low-
ered to protect them from an
approaching train; and that in
45 instances crossing flagmen,
standing until the last moment
waning them of an approaching
train, were run down, resulting
in three flagmen being killed and
39 injured. It will also be noted
that 942 or nearly one eighth of
the total, stalled on the track,
mainly as a result of failing to
shift before reaching track and
waiting til on track to do so.
