THE RAILROAD PAYS TAXES

Building our god roads took \$474,638.00 and on top of this re new their road beds purchase new equipment and provide for numerous other expenses. The purchases of the O. W. R. & N. in Oregon alone, for the year 1925, amounted to \$4,632,137.00

The County correct expense tax of this company on all of its lines, in Oregon and other states, was \$231,411.00. They also contributed \$41,370.82 through taxa tion to the relief of war veterans
