### THE RAILROAD PAYS TAXES

If the Small Son Asks You: Pa,  
Does the Railroad Pay Taxes?  
You Can Answer: Yes,  
Son, Quite a Smear.

The O. W. R. & N. Co. in Ore-  
gon, on 923 miles of track, assessed  
at \$43,520,691.00, pays a tax of  
\$1,223,852.80, in 1925.

Of this sum the County alone  
receives \$93,412.17.

This money goes for:  
Education, over 50 percent; good  
roads, 20 percent, these two items  
alone making over 70 percent of  
the taxation of the railroad.

The O. W. R. & N. Co. paid a  
total tax of \$2,298,408.06, and of  
that amount \$1,171,430.33 was  
for EDUCATION ALONE.

Building our good roads took  
\$474,638.00 and on top of this re-  
new their road beds, purchase  
new equipment and provide for  
numerous other expenses. The  
purchases of the O. W. R. & N.  
in Oregon alone, for the year  
1925, amounted to \$4,632,137.00

The County current expense  
tax of this company on all of its  
lines, in Oregon and other states,  
was \$231,411.00. They also con-  
tributed \$41,370.82 through taxa-  
tion to the relief of war veterans
