MILITARY TRAINING CAMPS

Active preparations for the Citizens' Military Training Camp for infantry, to be held at Vancouver barracks from June 17 to July 16, are under way at the present time and a complete tent camp, equipped with showers, bath houses, kitchens and mess halls will be in place ready for the 375 boys who are expected to take advantage of the opportunity or military and citizenship training during the vacation months.

The camp is open to boys between the ages of 17 and 24, inclusive, for the basic course. The expense of going to camp and returning home will be paid by the Government and each boy will be furnished with uniform, food and shelter, free of charge, while in camp.

Places have been reserved for three boys from Morrow County. No obligation for future service in any component of the United States army attached to attendance at Citizens, Military Training Camps.

Dairy Profit Special

A "Dairy Profits Special," with demonstration train of seven cars will tour eastern Oregon farm regions April 25 to 30 on the Union Pacific lines. This railroad has obtained the cooperation of the Oregon Agricultural College in the project. The train will include two car loads of dairy stock and swine, a flat car for demonstrations and speakers' stand, and a day coach of exhibits. There will be representatives of the dairy veterinary and livestock departments of the College; dairy breed representatives, the County Agents of each county visited and representatives of the railroad. Production and marketing will be stressed.

U. P. Shopmen to Get Wage Increase.

Omaha, Neb.—Increase in pay for 14,000 Union Pacific employes was announced here. Twelve thousand shop employes and 2000 miscellaneous workers, including mostly maintenance workers, firemen, mechanics and helpers will share in the raise, which will not exceed the rate of 2 cents an hour. The shopmen will get their increase effective December 1. Other employes' raises will start January 1. The increase is the result of increased output of the employes, G. H. Simms, assistant to the vice president in charge of operation, said.
