GOVERNOR PATTERSON
To GENERAL HINES
Salem, Oregon,
April 4, '27.

My Dear General Hines:

I am in receipt of your letter of March 24 concerning the Citizens' Military Training Camps of this corps area during the summer of 1927.

I have always been heartily in accord with the policy of providing military training for the young manhood of our nation. I do not believe in war as a medium of settling differences arising between nations. However I am not a pacifist and believe that it is our duty as a nation to be prepared for an emergency requiring force of arms to protect our country or its ideals, should such arise.

Since in the interests of economy, it has been decreed that the regular army be reduced to a force barely sufficient for the police of our borders and island possessions, it is apparent to every thoughtful individual that some method whereby the young men of the nation may obtain the rudiments of military training is mandatory.

Deficit of \$931,255 Confronts Oregon.
Salem, Or.—The state of Oregon on December 31, 1926, which marks the close of the current biennium, will face a deficit of approximately \$931,255 to meet its general fund obligations, according to a financial statement completed here by the secretary of state.

Gould Wins Seat as Maine's Senator.

Portland, Me.—Retention of republican control of the United States senate was assured by the election of Arthur H. Gould, republican, by a majority of approximately 50,000 over Fulton J. Redman, democrat, as senator from Maine. He will complete the term of the late Senator Fernald, expiring in 1931.

Mexico is Aiding Nicaragua Rebels.

Washington, D. C.—A formal accusation against the Mexican government of having aided Nicaraguan revolutionists, and an equally formal request for American intervention to make Mexico stop such activities, was filed with the state department by President Diaz of Nicaragua.

Dye From Fruit

Pomegranate is the fruit of a tree which grows in Syria, northern Africa and southern Europe. It is frequently mentioned in the Bible. The fruit, which is about the size of an orange, contains a large number of reddish seeds, each contained in a separate cell. The rind contains tannin, which is used in the manufacture of Morocco leather.

Famous London Prison

Newgate was long the chief prison of London. It was a gloomy building standing east of Holborn viaduct. Its history went back to 1218. It was destroyed by the great fire of 1666, and rebuilt, but partially destroyed during the Gordon riot of 1780. In 1902 Newgate prison was pulled down, and on its site was erected the Central Criminal Court.

Famous Cold Field

Witwatersrand is a low ridge of hills extending about 90 miles from east to west, in the southwestern part of the Transvaal, South Africa. Here are the famous goldfields and at the eastern end of the Rand is Johannesburg. Indications of gold were found there in 1853, and in the following year the district was proclaimed a goldfield.

Malayan Snake God

On Penang, an island off the east coast of the Malay peninsula, there is a temple in honor of the snake god worshiped under the name of Chor Su Kong. Inside the temple is crowded with snakes, ranging from 5 inches long to monsters as large as sea serpents. They are said never to harm the worshippers.

Well-Known Constellation

The Southern cross is a brilliant group of stars in the southern hemisphere, first reckoned a constellation in 1679. The four principal stars form a sort of cross. The upper and lower ones serve as a pointer to the South pole. It cannot be seen in the northern hemisphere except from very near the equator.

Ox Used in South America

In Venezuela and Colombia oxen still are widely used as beasts of burden. They are slow, but they are sure and will pack more than a mule. In Ecuador as many as 32 oxen are yoked together for pulling especially heavy loads.

First School Gardens

In America the school gardens movement had its beginning in the city of Boston in 1891, when Henry L. Clapp, principal of the George Haven Putnam school, established a wild-flower garden at his school.

Ornamental Designs
