> The six states having the largest number of cases were Indiana, Florida, California, Washington, Ohio and Texas. Oregon was 9th with 1557 cases reported. In con trast with these figures were Ver mont, 0, Rhode Island, 0, Deleware and New Hampshire, I each Connecticut, 2, Massachusetts. 4, Maryland, 5, New Jersey, 14, New York State with more than ten million population had only 305 cases and no deaths.

Of the 316 deaths in the United States, 236 occurred in California and 31 in Washington, Oregon had 5 deaths from this cause. The statistician of the A. A. M. P. points out that there is a close correlation betweeen the strength of the anti-vaccination movement and the number of deaths from smallpox.
