The smallpox record of 192 nce again gives to the Uniter of having reported more conetion this prventatle disesse than other country outside of Asis an cording to a bulletin redeived to day at the office of the Ored to Tuberculosis Association. The fii ores were tabulated ty the Ame can Assciation for Medical Prog. ress, New York City. A total 33,752 cases were reported in the United State last year. The six states having the larg est number of cases were Indiana Fiorids, California, Wsshington, Ohio and Texas. Oregon was 9:h with 1557 cases reported. In con trast with these figures were Ver mont, 0 , Rhode Island, 0 , Deleware and New Hampshire, 1 each Connecticut, 2, Massachusetts. 4, Maryland, 5, New Jersey, 14. New York State with more than ten million population had only 305 cases and no deaths. Of the 316 deaths in the United Ststes, 236 occurred in California and 51 in Washington. correlation betweeen the strength of the anti-vaceination movement and the number of deaths fiom
smallpox.
