on November 15, 1927, pursuant to the

**HUNTER NEWS LETTER**

Oregon District, April, 1927

During April 30 hunters  
worked all or part time and  
turned in the skins and scalps of  
564 coyotes, 26 bobcats, a total  
of 590 predatory animals. In  
addition, 103 unborn coyotes and  
4 unborn bobcats, 39 badgers, 59  
porcupines, and twelve skunks  
were destroyed. An average of  
21 predatory animals, not count-  
ing unborn young destroyed, per  
man per thirty days was taken  
and those that destroyed this  
many or more are:

- Alva Stone, Morrow County, 30 days: Coyotes, Adult, 8; pup, 106, total, 114.
- Harold Abalt, Morrow, 30 days: Coyotes, adult, 9, pup, 103, total, 108.
- Fred Peterson, Umatilla, 30 days: Coyotes, adult 4, pup, 55; total, 59.
- Tom Rice, Gilliam, 30 days: Coyotes, adult 7, pup, 32; total 39.
- Adam Knoblock, Morrow, 30 days: Coyotes, adult 3, pup, 24; total 27.
- B. Sarrett, Willows, 30 days: Coyotes, adult 25.
- O. A. Philbrick, Wheeler, 27 days: Bobcats, 5; Coyotes, adult 11, pup 9, total 25.
- H. J. Roosa, Lake, 24 days: Coyotes, adult, 1, pup 23; total 24.
- W. A. Southerland, Willows, 30 days: Coyotes, adult, 13, pup, 9; total 22.
