EDUCATION LE MEXICO Calles governmen's found their opportunity to enler upon the fund amentar task of educating the masse in the roral districts.

Hitherto education has been argely confined to the larger cities. When President Calles assumed office in 1924, he instructed his secretrry of education to ertablish at least 5,000 rural schools dur ing his presidency. Two thousand of these schools are already in operation and a third 1,000 is pro jected for 1927.

Birthstones are among the oldest forms of jewelry. The group of 12 stones, one for each month of the calendar year, may have been related to the 12 stones in the breastplate worn by the High Priest Aaron as described in the Book of Evodus. Each of the 12 stones represented one of the tribes of the Children of Israel and the name of the tribe was inscribed on the stone. As early as 4000 B. C. another high priest, this time Expt. were a breastplate of 12 stones, or crosses Ancien Engetian corwings preserve this interesting bit of bistory.
