Conners' Ranch,
July 30, '27
Editor Independent:

I am work
ing on this ranch again. I worked
through harvest here in 1902, 19
17 and again in 1927, and I am
wondering if I will work again,
a quarter of a century later. May
be possible but hardly possible.
This ranch lays about 12 miles
west of Ione and is about 1300 ft.
above sea level. The wheat crop
is running from 20 to 30 bushels
per acre. The crop here would
more than pay for the land it
grows on. I wonder how that
would sound to farmers in the
Mississippi valley.

The Connor family came from
Fort Scott, Kansas, and settled
here about forty years ago this
summer, and have made a success
of farming,—own a large tract
of land, well stocked, good imple
ments and out of debt. Farmers
here say this land is capable of
producing forty bushels of wheat
to the acre with fifteen inches of
annual rain fall. We had less
than twelve inches this year.

I ran onto a Railroad Guide giv
ing the elevations of all the R.
R. towns of this section of coun
try and it was very interesting
and surprising to me. The figures
are as follows:

- Portland 25 ft. above sea level
- Arlington 225
- Condon 2884
- Heppner 1905
- Ione 1090
- Morgan 798
- Penbleton 1069
- Walla Walla 906
- Lewiston 736

It hardly seems possible that
Lewiston, Idaho, is lower than
Morgan and that there is nearly
as much fall from Heppner to
Ione as from Ione to Portland
and that the railroad climbs 2659
feet from Arlington to Condon, but
it is straight goods.

This part of the country is in
fested with lots of big black
horse flies, this season, and we
lose a good deal of time swatting
them. They make a gentle horse
go locoed and hog wild. I never
saw horse flies out in the fields
before.

I always give the boys a toast
when we water up, something
like this: Here's to the American
Eagle and the Flag that makes
us free; Good cold water from an
oil water sack is good enough for
me.

Well, I must ring off as I must
wash out my shirts, for I've tar
weed in my socks, baby mine,
baby mine, And I'll keep them
for a relic baby mine.

DONT LET MOSQUITOS BITE

Mosquitos are found in almost
every locality where there is an
opportunity for them to breed,
and the opportunity depends sim
ply on the presence at some tim
during the year of standing water.
Mosquitos have been more preva
lent this year in Oregon, on ac
count of the late high water. The
sloughs and standing back waters
are excellent breeding places for
mosquitos. Although malaria is
an uncommon disease in this sec
tion, if mosquito control is not giv
serious consideration, it will un
doubtedly become much more
prevalent than now.

The control and extermination
of mosquitos involves the appli
cation of many methods. There
are, however, three principal
methods for preventing the breed
ing of mosquitos. They are the
draining of all standing or stag
nant water, destroying the mos
quito larvae with a larvicide and
the planting of top minnows to
eat the larvae.

Male mosquitos are vegetari
ans. Female mosquitos are the
biters. The females have devel
oped a taste for blood, and indeed
blood has become indispensable
to the full development of their
egg. Remembering how all im
portant the generative instinct
is, we can well understand why
the mosquito will return again
and again to obtain her fill of
this life perpetuating fluid.

"Humanity" Student
Humanist may be defined as a stu
dent of human affairs. In this sense
Shakespeare is called the great hu
manist. The term more generally
means a student of the "humanities,"
that is, a student of the ancient clas
sical languages, literature and history.

Ancient Utensils
The tyg and pignin, spoken of in old

cup with many handles; the pignin
was a shallow vessel with a handle
at one side for the purpose of hold
ing out the liquor brewed in the tyg.

tant specimen is assigned to the
Fifteenth century, but it is certain that
this art was followed at a very much
earlier date.

Lord Derby, who instituted it in 1780.
