





The, sloughs and standing back waters are excellent breeding places for mosquitos. Although malaria is an uncomon ( i sease in this s' te, if mosquito control is not giv n sesious consideation, it will un doubtenly become much more: prevalent than now.

The control and extermination of mosquitos involves the appli cation of many methods. There are, however, three principal methods for preventing the breed iug of mosquitos. They are the times on June 1. It is maned after draining of all standing or stag nant wate, destroying the mos quito larvae with a larvicide and the planting of top minnows to eat the larvae.

Male mosqnitoes are vere a i ans. Female mosquitos are the biters.
