SCHOOL HYGIENE

The function of Oregon schools
is not alone to teach but also to
equip children with the qualifica-
tions necessary to carry on the
work of healthy American citizen-
ship. Is not health a very import-
ant qualification? The child's
health must not be neglected dur-
ing the hours he is compelled to
attend school. The health of the
school is affected by the person-
al hygiene of teachers and pupils.
Health education should be a
part of the regular school pro-
gram. Little children should be
taught the value of cleanliness
and regularity.

Very few grown ups realize
the mental and physical strain
the six olds are under when they
first start the great adventure of
going to school. The child has
some pretty hard problems to
tackle, and needs all the reserve
force that can be mustered for
him.

Special care for him at this
time, particularly with reference
to hours of rest and sleep, and
the avoidance of unnecessary ex-
citement will do much to give
these beginners at school the
mental poise that is so much need-
ed. It is equally important that
they be given simple, nourishing
food, at times and in quantities,
most favorable to digestion.

A child of six needs twelve
hours sleep at night. After the
beginning of the school year
7:30 should be the regular bed-
time, and this rule should not be
broken. Little children should
never be taken out to evening
entertainments, movies and other
exciting diversions. There will be
plenty of time for them later on.

in the Courthouse in Heppner, Ore-
gon, for the purchase of an issue of
bonds of Morrow County, for the
construction of permanent roads there-
in in the sum of one hundred twenty
thousand dollars (\$120,000), said
bonds to be in denominations of \$1,-
000 each, numbered 1 to 120, inclu-
sive, to bear date of September 1,
1927, and to mature serially in nu-
merical order at the rate of \$6,000 on
the first day of September in each of
the years 1933 to 1952, inclusive, the
first maturing \$78,000 per value of
said bonds to bear interest at 4 3/4%
per annum and the last maturing
\$42,000 per value of said bonds to
bear interest at the rate of 4 1/2% per
annum, payable semi-annually on the
first days of March and September,
principal and interest payable in gold

ENROLLMENT INCREASES RAPIDLY IN HIGH SCHOOLS

There has been an almost unbe-
lievable increase in enrollment
in the high schools of North Car-
olina during the last 15 years.
Recently compiled statistics show
that in 1910 there were only
12,570 pupils enrolled in all North
Carolina's high schools, whereas
the enrollment for the year 1925-
26 is 469, an increase of 76,999
pupils or 681 per cent, in fifteen
years.

The number of graduates climb-
ed from 510 to 11,352. Of the num-
ber graduating year before last
only 592 finished at non-standard
high schools.

STATE UNIVERSITY

Eugene, Ore.

Showing a total enrollment of 98, an increase
of more than 25 per cent over last
year, the Post Session of the
University has just ended here,
with final examinations. Of the
total number more than twenty
were graduate students, it is
stated by Dr. Dan E. Clark, direc-
tor, and the work throughout was
highly concentrated and interest-
ing.

A faculty of nine professors
and instructors offered twelve
courses at the session. These
courses were in economics, educa-
tion, English history and psy-
chology. Students were required
to attend classes daily, and two
hours credit were given for each
course taken.

easily colored by dipping globes into
a solution of colloidum, previously col-
ored to suit, with aniline soluble in
colloidum. Dip and rotate quickly,
balls down, until dry.

255 to meet its general fund obliga-
tions, according to a financial state-
ment completed here by the secretary
of state.
