these booklets have been published
and can be obtained free of

teur, French bacteriologist. The
first three of these are native
Americans and Pasteur was close-
ly associated with a number of
American scientists of the time.

Walter Reed's work in proving
that the Aedes Aegypti mosquito
was the only carrier of yellow
fever paved the way for the work
of General W. C. Gorgas who
reared the canal zone from this
pest and made possible the build-
ing of the Canal,
done by the Metropolitan Life
Insurance Company in a series

MONTANA MASONS GIVE CEMENT TO BRITISH

Desiring to have some part in
the construction of the great Mas-
sonic temple now being built in
London by the Grand Lodge of
England and wishing to express
their admiration and respect of
that Grand Lodge as the Mother
Grand Lodge of the world, the
Masons of the Grand Lodge of
Montana sent to England a half
ton of Montana cement to be
used in cementing together some
of the stones in the Masonic tem-
ple in London, the corner stone of
which was laid July 14.

"We hope this cement, thus
spread in your new temple, will
symbolize a new and binding union
between the Mother Lodge of the
World and the Grand Lodge of
Montana, and as our Montana
cement becomes stronger with
age, so may the ties of brotherly
love thus strengthened become
stronger as the years go by,"
read part of the letter sent to
the Grand Lodge of England.

Sir Francis Davis, Provincial
Grand Master of Worcestershire,
representative of the Grand Lodge
of Montana near the United Grand
Lodge of England said in answer:
"If I may say so, the Montana
brethren have been happily in-
spired in choosing cement, as by
so doing they symbolize the close
brotherhood of Freemasons all
over the world and more espe-
cially among English speaking
peoples."

"Auto" Derivation

At a business meeting of the

At a business meeting of the
