Portland, Ore., Oct. 19:  
"The West, and particularly Oregon, is taking the lead in the development of aviation in the United States," said Tex Rankin, president of the Rankin Flying school here, in a review of the progress of flying before a civic club meeting last week. Rankin, with an flyer, has just completed an extensive tour of aviation fields in the Middle West and in the East.

\$9,000,000,000 is being spent in the large cities alone and probably one tenth that much in the smaller towns for aviation purposes.
