JOHANNES TROEDSON CALLED BY DEATH

Passes Away at His Home Sunday Evening

Johannes Troedson, for 38 years a resident of Morrow Co., died at his home in Ione Sunday afternoon. The immediate cause of his death was an apoplectic stroke but he had been suffering for some time with general debility due to old age. The stroke occurred in the morning and death followed at about 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon.

Mr. Troedson was born in the town of Skane, Sweden, April 6, 1853. He came to America in 1874 and for some years made his home in California.

He was married in San Francisco, January 19, 1884, to Mrs. Christine Carlson. To this union there were born three children: Anne C., Clara S. and Carl F.

He came in October 1889 to Morrow County where he resided to the day of his death, October 23, 1927.

He left to mourn his loss, his wife, one daughter, Anne C.; two sons; Carl F. Troedson, of Ione, and J. A. Carlson, of King City, Cal.; one brother, Paul Troedson of Gladstone, Oregon.

The funeral service was held from the Congregational church in Ione, the Rev. C. G. Blomquist of Portland officiating, and interment was made in Ione cemetery. Friends and relatives from far and near filled the church and brought a wealth of floral offerings.

RESTRICTIVE IMMIGRATION BENEFITS, STATES DAVIS

Los Angeles, Cal.—Restrictive immigration is the greatest piece of legislation that has been enacted for fifty years, states secretary of labor, James J. Davis, in urging more drastic immigration laws before the convention of the American Federation of Labor. He declared that the present scale of wages prevailing in American industries—the highest in history—would have been impossible without it. Never before has American industry been so free from strife as it is at present, he added.

Resolutions in committee for submission to the delegates included one demanding the withdrawal of the war fleet and marines from China, Haiti, Nicaragua and other countries occupied by the United States armed forces, proposed by John Sullivan of New York.

Another one proposed that Mexico, Cuba, and independent countries of Central or South America which are under the non quota regulations of the immigration law, be placed under quota law.

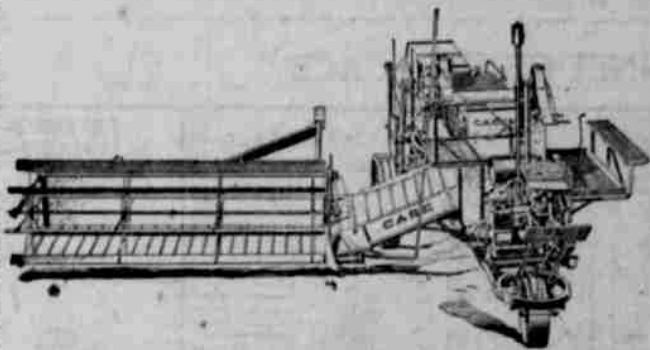
