LOCAL ITEMS

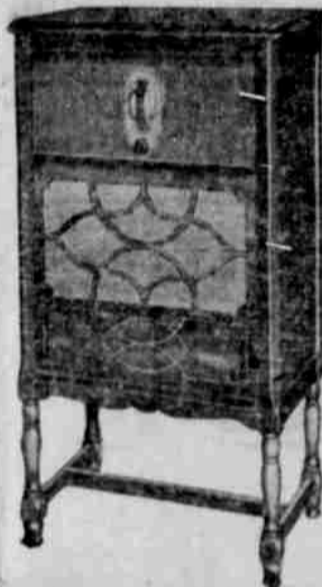
The Dorcas Society will hold a food and fancywork sale on Saturday the 3d of December, at J. E. Swanson's Grain Office.

Mr. and Mrs. Martin Bauren feind were visiting Mr. and Mrs. Robert Balcomb, at Irigon, Sunday afternoon.

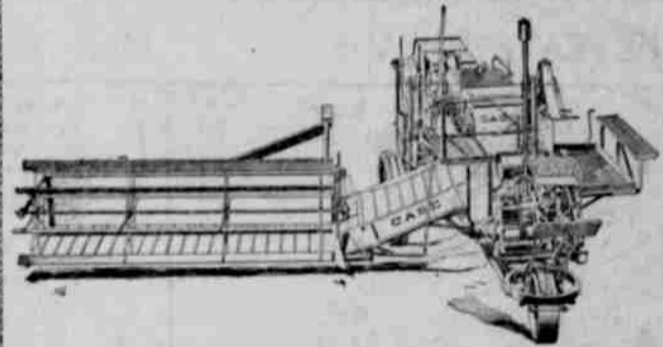
Quite a number of the Morganites attended the sale, Monday.
