MILK BY THE CARLOAD

Shipment of milk by tank car instead of in ten gallon cans loaded into express or special cars has increased in the last five years. More than 60 tank-cars handle milk into Chicago. Each car includes two steel tanks of three thousand gallons capacity, glass lined, cork insulated, and protected by a steel jacket. One tank car will transport more milk than two of the cars commonly used.

STUDENT LOANS SAFE

O. A. C., Nov. 24.
When money is loaned to a student here through the student loan fund committee, there is less than one chance in four thousand that the money will not be returned with the nominal 4 per cent interest charged. A report just issued by the committee shows that although total loans aggregating \$211,588, have been made since the fund was established in 1911, losses have amounted to less than one fortieth of one per cent. For every dollar lost nearly \$12 have been accumulated in interest. The loans are unsecured except by the character of those applying.
