AMERICAN FOREST WEEK

George W. Peavy, dean of the school of forestry, Corvallis, Oregon, has been selected as Oregon State Chairman for American Forest Week by Colonel Theo. Roosevelt, national chairman, according to word received by the United States Forest Service, Portland, Oregon.

American Forest Week has been set for April 22 to 28 this year and it is said that plans are already underway for its observance. President Coolidge will probably proclaim the Week as is his custom.

This is the ninth year of the Week's observance in Oregon and Washington, where it originated in 1920. The celebration this year will be largely centered in the schools, the main feature being prize essay contests for the high schools of the States, according to John D. Gutarie, of the U. S. Forest Service, who is secretary of the Oregon State Committee.
