This will be the first all-state Christian Endeavor convention to be held east of the mountains and the young people of this part of the state are intending to take advantage of its nearness to them.

Rev. D. W. Prætorius, national young people's worker of the Evangelical churches of the United States, will be the chief convention speaker. Paul C. Brown of Los Angeles who travels all over the coast in the interests of Christian Endeavor, will also be a prominent person in the convention. Dr. Norman K. Tully, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Salem, will be there to participate in the program, as will also Walter L. Myers of Eugene. Prof. C. H. Hoggatt of Eugene will lead the singing and Miss Lulu Aydelott of the same city, will preside at the piano.

There will be inspirational addresses, enjoyable singing, conferences on practical Christian Endeavor plans, graded Christian Endeavor Meetings, a parade banquet and all that goes to make these annual gatherings attractive to young people.




