DEATH CALLS

MRS. L. P. CARLE

Funeral services for Mrs. Luvena P. Carle, who died at her home, Sunday, April 1, were held at the Congregational church Monday Afternoon.

Mrs. Carle was born Dec. 13, 1852, in Decatur, Michigan. She married Thomas J. Carle, March 31, 1880, in Cass Co., Missouri moving to Weston, Oregon where she lived a few years. After living on a homestead north of Ione they moved about 1894 to Ione where she helped her husband who was postmaster a few years. Then they moved to the house, where she was living during her last years and there conducted a rooming house.

She is survived by one sister, Mrs. Dolly French of Edgely, North Dakota and three step children, Mrs. Lenora D. Holland of Seattle, Wash., Mrs. Luvisa L. Louy of Ione, and Mr. A. C. Carle of Astoria, Oregon.
