Five cases of tick fover developed in the state last week. Dr. Frederick D. Stricker, secretary of the state board of health, reported. There were three cases of septic gore throat and three of erysipelus. P.fty-six cases of smallpox were listed as were three of typhoid fever, three of diphtheria, 25 of scarlet fever, 42 of measles, 25 of influenza, seven of whooping cough, 15 of tuberculosis, 21 of pneumonia, 42 of chickenpox, 23 of mumps and one of infantile paralysis.
